A Polite Reminder About Parking and Respect for Our Local Community

We kindly ask all parents and carers to be mindful of parking regulations and respectful attitudes towards our local village community during school drop-off and collection times.

There have been several reports of illegal parking and instances of disrespectful behaviour towards residents and local businesses. This includes parking along Outwoods Lane and Bushton Lane, where double yellow lines clearly indicate no parking. Parking in these areas is illegal and poses a safety risk to children and other road users.

The Parish Council has specifically requested that we remind families to park safely and courteously, and to avoid blocking driveways or causing obstructions. This is essential for the safety and wellbeing of all children and members of our community.

We are very grateful to The Bell Inn Pub, who generously allow parents to use their car park for school drop-off and pick-up. However, there have unfortunately been incidents of abusive behaviour towards pub staff when they have asked parents to park responsibly. This behaviour is unacceptable and jeopardises the continued use of this facility. Please show appreciation and respect to The Bell Inn staff so we can maintain this valuable arrangement.

Additionally, please be aware that the cobbled area at the end of Outwoods Lane is private property, and parking there is not authorised.

 Online Safety & Cyberbullying

As part of our focus this year, we'll also be talking to children about online safety and the importance of respectful behaviour on the internet. Cyberbullying can be just as harmful as bullying in person, and we want all our pupils to feel safe and supported wherever they are.

Parents and carers – please help us by regularly monitoring your child's online activity.

Talk to them about what they're doing online, who they're talking to, and how they can stay safe. Together, we can help children build healthy digital habits and know what to do if something doesn't feel right. On Monday this week, we had two police office visitors visit one of our classes to talk to children about responsible online usage and the reason that certain apps and games have age restrictions on them. Please help your child to understand and follow these expectations.

 Keep the Conversation Going

We encourage families to continue these conversations at home. Ask your child what they've learned during Anti-Bullying Week and how they can help make our school – and the online world – a kinder place for everyone.

School staff are always happy to help. We can support you in making referrals and offer wellbeing and emotional support in school. Please don't hesitate to reach out.

We now have two trained Emotional Literacy Support Assistants in school - Mrs Kavanagh and Miss Smith. Our Designated safeguarding leads are Mrs Rowe, Mrs Day, Mrs Kirkman and soon to be trained will be Miss Twells!

Together, we can ensure every child feels safe, supported, and ready to thrive.

Uniform & Appearance Reminder – Jewellery, PE Kits, and Personal Presentation

We kindly remind parents and children of the following expectations as part of our school uniform policy:

- Earrings: If worn, must be small, plain studs only.
- Jewellery: No necklaces or other jewellery should be worn during the school day.
- Makeup and Nails: No makeup, including lip gloss, and no nail polish, gel nails, or false nails should be worn in school.
- Lip Salves and Cough Sweets: If needed for medical reasons, these must be handed in to the school office and not kept in bags or pockets.
- Hair: Long hair must be tied back at all times for safety and hygiene.

If a child wears jewellery or makeup that does not comply with our policy, staff will ask them to remove it. Jewellery will be placed in a small envelope and returned to the child at the end of the day.

As an active school—especially during our OPAL playtimes—we strongly discourage wearing jewellery at any time for safety reasons. Earrings must always be removed for PE lessons, in line with the Safe Practice Advice for Physical Education.

We also remind families that PE kits must follow our uniform policy. Kits should be plain and unbranded, with only the school logo, to maintain consistency.

We have a plentiful supply of spare uniform, ongoing lost property supplies that parents may pop in to school and use for their child if required.

Thank you for your continued support in helping us keep our children safe, active, and proud of their school identity.


