Congratulations to one of our Year 6 pupils, Paige, who last Sunday represented West Midlands in the National Finals in Gymnastics.

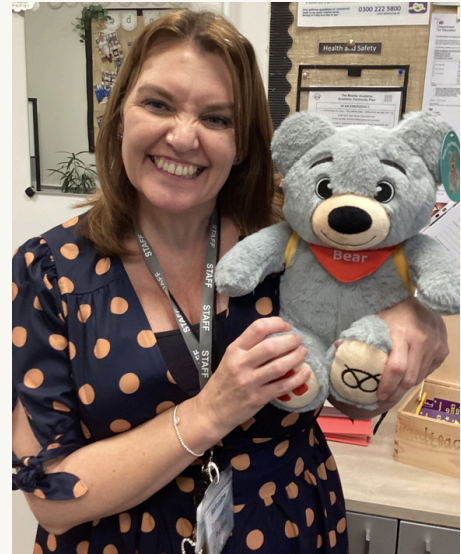
She had an amazing day placing 2nd and with her combined score from both national finals she has been ranked 3rd in Great Britain for her age!
