Road safety reminders

Please can we ask that any child walking home either with a friend or alone, wears something bright or carries a torch. We have had a few reports from community residents who raise concerns about children walking home alone in the dark. If you wish your child to walk home alone, we need written consent from a parent emailed into the school office. This only applies to our year 5 and 6 children please. Mrs Rowe has a meeting with the Staffordshire road safety team next week to look at additional ways that we can work with the children and our families to support road safety in our community.

The cold weather has arrived!

This week has seen a sudden drop in temperatures and some children are still not bringing a warm coat into school. Please ensure that children are dressed for cold weather as children will play outside at lunch and playtimes to ensure they have opportunity to get out in the fresh air and be physically active every day!

Care plans and medication in school
