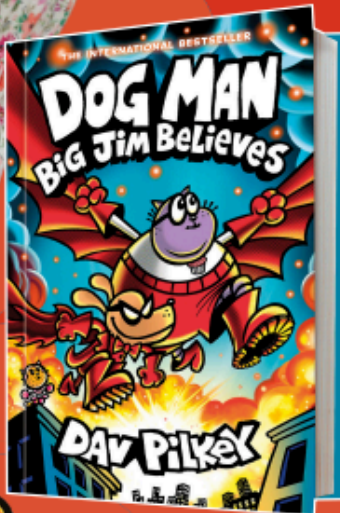

To prevent the health visitor from sending messages to you, text STOP to our number. Messages are charged at your usual rates.

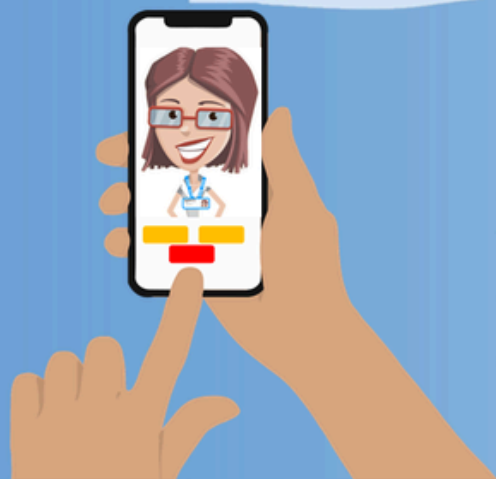
