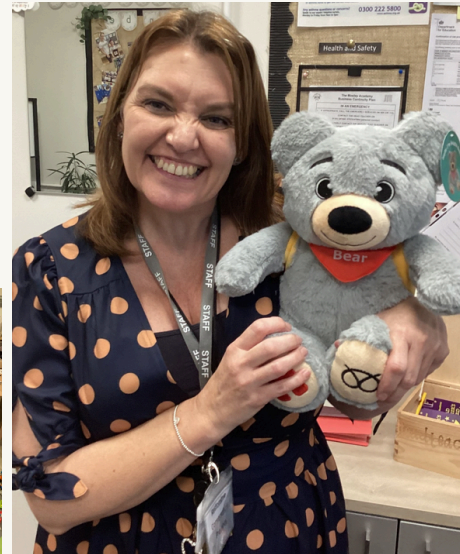

YouTube

What is YouTube? A popular video-sharing platform where people can watch, create, and interact with videos, while needing to be mindful of privacy, content suitability, and online safety when using YouTube.

Platform Overview



YouTube is a popular online video-sharing platform where users can watch, upload, share, and comment on videos. Content ranges from entertainment, music, and gaming to educational videos, news, and live streams.

Anyone with an internet connection can view most videos, while creating an account allows users to upload content, comment, and subscribe to channels.

Potential Risks

User-generated content: Videos are uploaded by people from around the world, meaning content quality and appropriateness can vary.

Age-appropriate use: Some videos may include strong language, misinformation, or themes not suitable for children.

Comments and interaction: Users can interact through comments and live chats, which may expose them to cyberbullying, scams, or inappropriate messages.

Advertising and data: YouTube shows ads and collects user data to personalise content and recommendations.

Privacy risks: Sharing personal information in videos, comments, or profiles can put users at risk.

Potential Benefits

- Content reporting and blocking tools.
- Privacy settings and comment controls.
- Restricted Mode to help filter mature content.
- YouTube Kids, a separate app designed for younger users.
- Parental supervision tools through Google Family Link.

Core Features



Video streaming: Watch videos on demand across a wide range of topics and genres

Content creation: Upload, edit, and publish videos to a personal or public channel

Subscriptions: Follow channels to receive updates on new content

Search and recommendations: Discover videos through search and personalised suggestions

Comments and likes: Interact with creators and other viewers

Live streaming: Watch or host real-time broadcasts

Playlists: Organise and save videos for later viewing

Safety and controls: Reporting tools, Restricted Mode, and parental supervision options

Tip For Caregivers

- Think critically about what they watch and share.
- Avoid clicking suspicious links or ads.
- Keep personal information private.
- Use platform safety settings and parental controls where appropriate.
- Report harmful or inappropriate content.

THERE ARE TWO TYPES OF FREE SCHOOL MEAL...

UNIVERSAL INFANTS FREE SCHOOL MEALS (UIFSM)

Pupils in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 (KS1) are entitled to a free school meal regardless of income.

All you need to do is inform your school that you wish your child to have a daily hot meal.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS (FSM)

Your child may be entitled to a Free School Meal. However, with FSM you will need to apply. The link on this sheet is for your local authority (search your postcode) and there is information from the Government website about FSM. Your child's school will also have an application form, if you prefer to complete it by hand.

Free school meals give children the nutrition they need to thrive during the school day - boosting focus, learning, health. and overall wellbeing.

Each day, your child can choose a hot meal (with two main options) or a sandwich, served with dessert, fresh fruit or yoghurt, and a drink. Menus are available on the school website, and our Catering Manager is happy to discuss any food allergies, intolerances or dietary requirements.
