Punctuality reminder

We would like to remind parents that the main doors close at 8.50 am, arrival after this time is classed as late and we ask that you accompany your child to the main office and sign your child in to school.

Lates are monitored and can in fact, lead to unauthorised absences which can in turn lead to penalty notices. The day starts very promptly in school and when a child is late, they may miss out on the morning welcome task, important preparation to the school day and time to connect with their class teacher and friends, ensuring a positive and purposeful start to the day.

Suncream in school

If children need to bring in suncream, please can you ensure this is labelled with your child's name on. It must be handed in to the class teacher at the beginning to the day, for your child to use during the day. Please can you remind your child that they must not take it outside during the day and it is for their own use. We have reminded all children in assembly.

We recommend the 8 hours sun cream for your child and this can be applied before school when required.

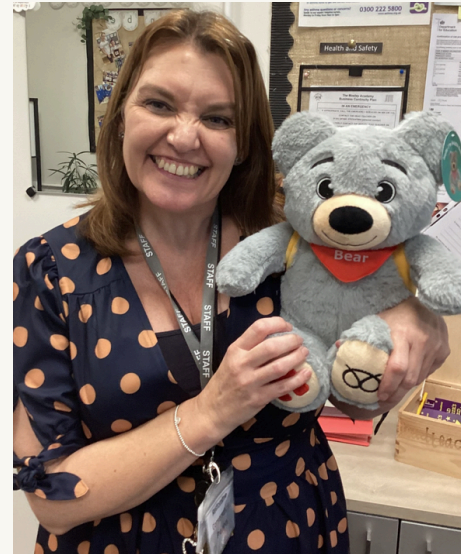
