Homework will be sent home every Wednesday and it should take around 30 minutes to complete. There will be a maths and an English based task each week that consolidates learning we have done in class. Spelling tests will be completed on a Monday and new spellings will be sent home for you to support your child's learning. These will be linked to the spelling lesson that the children complete that day. The spelling word for the week will also be on Spelling Shed for the children to be able to do additional practise. Logins will be sent home in their reading records for you.
