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What have we been up to this week?

This week we have been reading Little Red Hen and non-fiction books about farms

In Phonics this week we have been reading words with two or more digraphs. This week our focus words for spelling and writing have been words such as sharp, sheet, tooth, chart, short, thinker, corner and shorter. Please see the attached home learning sheet to help you practice these at home.

In Literacy we have been innovating the story of Little Red Hen by replacing the characters with different animals that we chose and then re-telling the story with our new innovations. We have also been using our story maps from last week to write the original story.

In Maths we have been looking at the composition of the number 8 and ordering the numbers 1-10. We have also been learning about comparing length.

In our topic work we have been learning about foods that come from farms - directly or indirectly. We have looked at some of the crops grown on farms and talked about what foods we eat that are made from those crops such as bread, Weetabix, cornflakes etc We have also learnt about what meats and other products come from different farm animals including how milk is also used to make cheese, yoghurts and ice cream.

We have also done some computing this week looking at what devices we can access the internet from and how to do a basic google search to find out information together.

Next week we will be...

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- Reading longer words, compound words and words ending with -ing
- > Inventing our own 5-sentence stories
- Working on the composition of 7 and representing the number 7
- Learning about height
- Learning about the life cycle of a hen
- Learning about farm animals and their babies.
