What have we been up to this week?

This week we have been reading 'The Tiny Seed' and other books about growing and changing.

This week we have been revisiting and revising in phonics and have been reading longer words and words ending with -ing, -s or -es. This week our focus words for spelling and writing have been words such as vanish, mammoth, visit, poison, coats, cooks, wishes and boxes. Please note that there is no phonics home learning sheet for this week.

In Literacy we have been doing some shared writing, writing a recipe for how to make bread. We followed our instructions to make the bread and then added photos of our baking process to improve our instructions even further. We had to remember all the features of a recipe/instruction text from when we made gingerbread men, but we were superstars and knew exactly how to write a recipe!

In Maths we have been looking at how to sort and group objects according to their attributes and also looking at odd and even 'tops' using numicon.

We had a lovely trip at the Adventure Farm on Wednesday putting our learning on farms, the life cycle of a hen, food from farms and farm animals into real-life context. We fed the lambs, learnt more about farms, went on a tractor ride and had a lovely play too! We are finishing our week and indeed ending our spring term with our whole-school enrichment morning and a little leaving party in the afternoon.

## After Easter we will be...

- > Working on phase 4 words with short vowels
- > Learning the new tricky words 'said' 'so' 'have' 'like'
- Reading the Very Hungry Caterpillar and becoming familiar with this story

- Counting sounds and other things that cannot be seen
- Counting larger sets of objects
- Learning how we have changed since we were babies
- > Introducing a new artist called Matisse

## Ways to help at home...

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- Practice writing short phrases and sentences independently with finger spaces.
- > Count to 30 out loud.
- Ask your child to invent their own 5-sentence story!
- Practice recognition of odd and even numbers you can't make a pair with an odd number!
